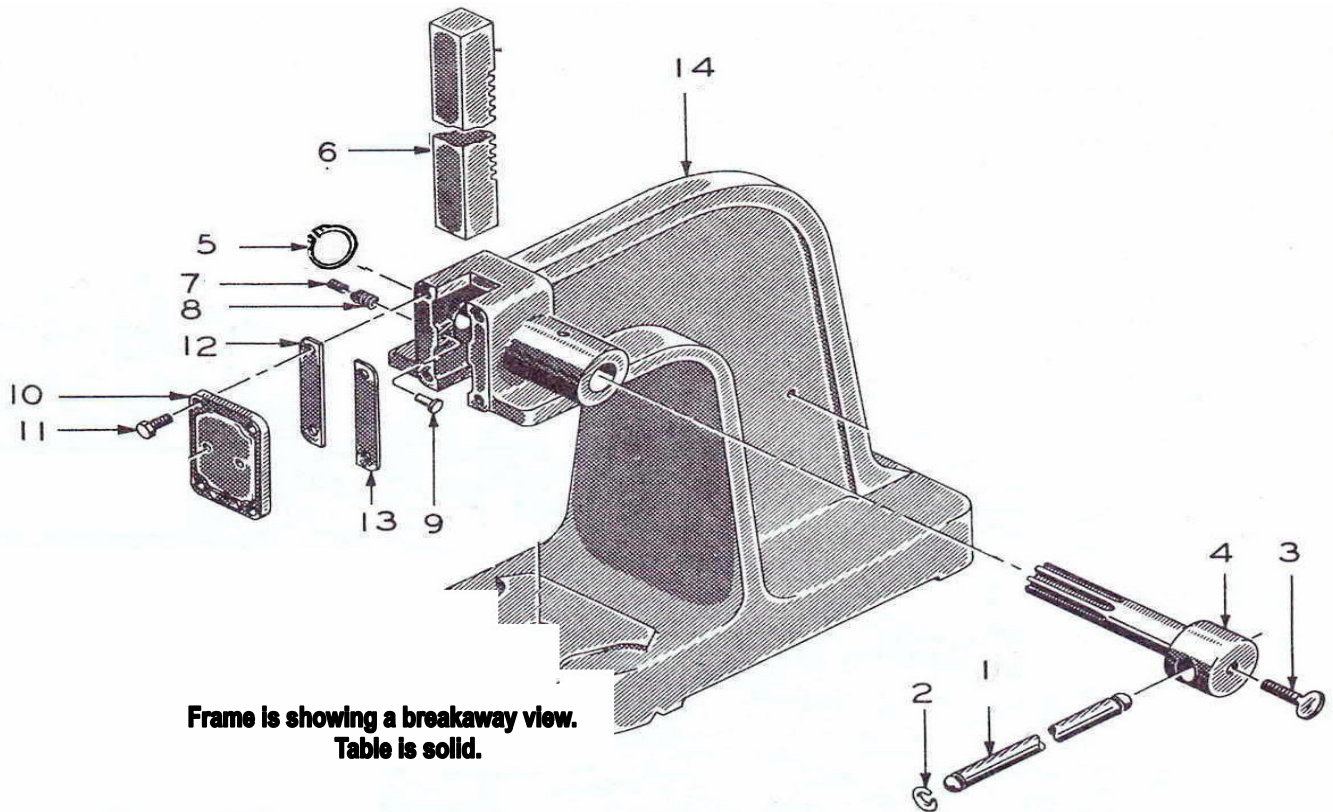
Ordering information: Please order all repair parts by part number and name, also mention model number of press. All parts are shipped F.O.B. Factory in Grand Haven, MI.

Lubrication: Keep all working parts of the press well oiled for easier operation. Also keep a light film of oil over the entire surface of the ram to prevent rust.
